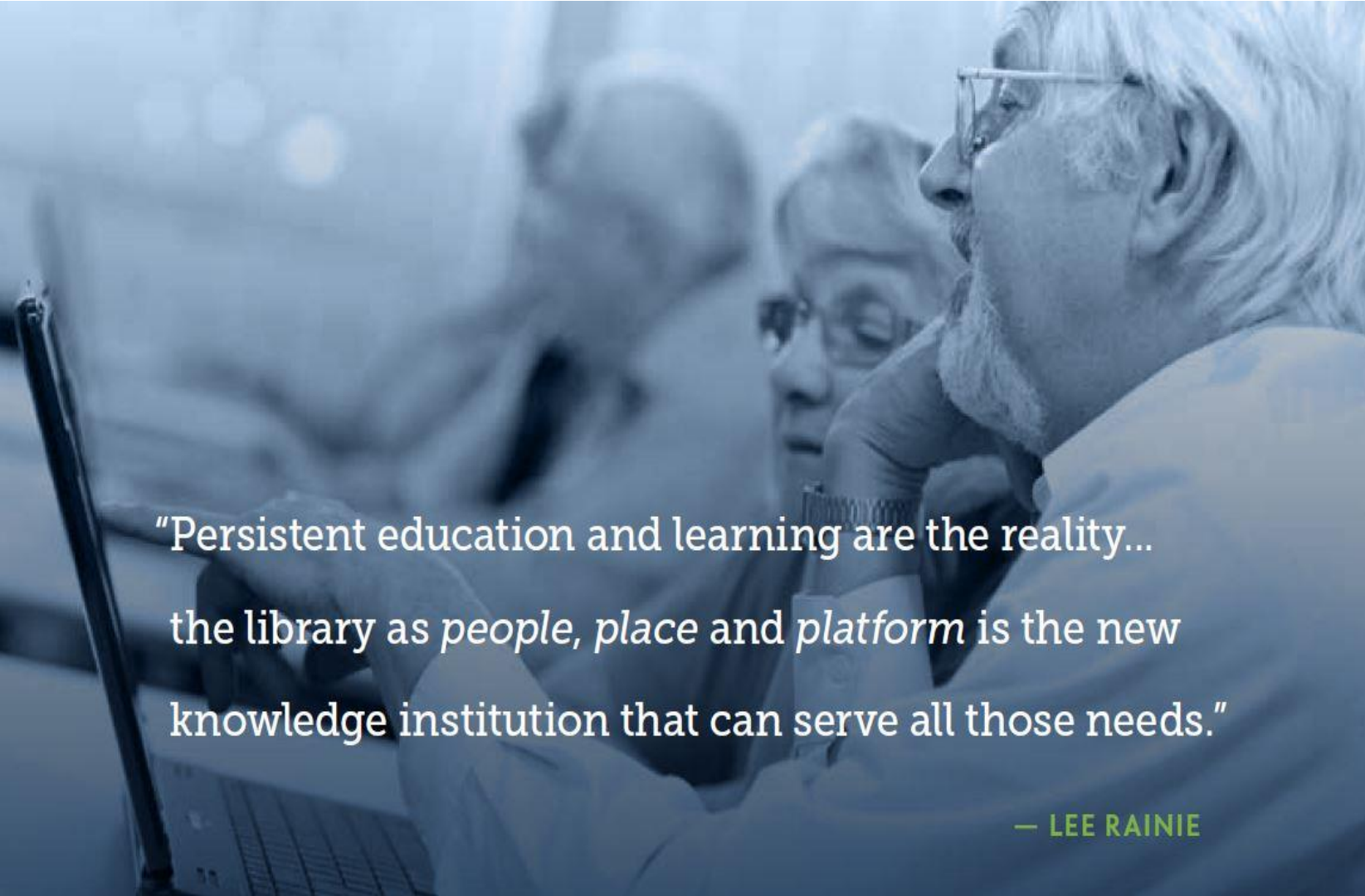


# Libraries – Critical Partner in the Educational Ecosystem

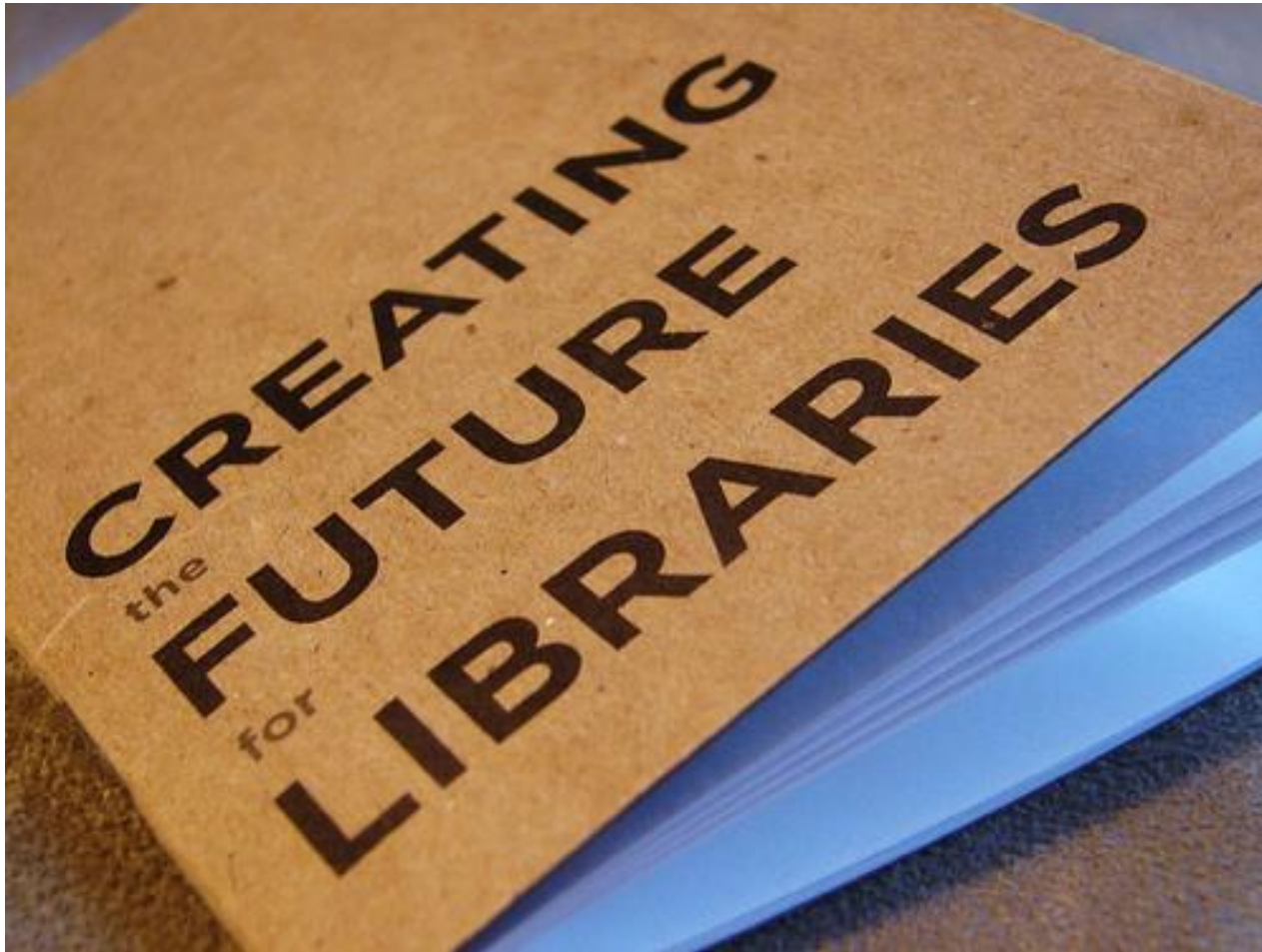

# ACTION STEPS FOR LIBRARY LEADERS, POLICYMAKERS & THE COMMUNITY





# Library Leaders

- Define the scope of the library's programs, services and offerings around community priorities
- Develop partnerships and collaborations
- Measure outcomes and impacts to communicate the library's value to the community
- Engage the community in planning and decision making

# Policymakers

- Define libraries as part of the community's priority infrastructure
- Develop strategic alliances and partnerships with local library leaders to advance educational, economic and social goals
- Leverage the economic development potential of the public library as a community platform
- Support and accelerate deployment of high-speed broadband & wi-fi to all libraries

# Community Partners

- Connect the community's knowledge resources to the library's networks & platform
- Volunteer organizational and technical expertise to mentor and support learning that takes place in library spaces and on its platform
- Develop strategic partnerships and alliances with public libraries
