1. Introductions:

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

A Motion to approve the agenda was moved by Margaret Miles and seconded by Marilyn Cochran. The

Motion passed unanimously.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MAY 11, 2007 COUNCIL MEETING:

A Motion to approve the May 11, 2007 meeting minutes was made by Derek Wolfgram and seconded by Marilyn Cochran. The Motion passed unanimously.

5. APPROVAL OF EMAIL PERSONNEL BALLOT OF AUGUST 27, 2007

A Motion to approve the emailed personnel ballot dated August 27, 2007 was made by Marilyn Cochran and seconded by Margaret Miles. The Motion passed unanimously.

6. SYSTEM ADVISORY BOARD REPORT

Laura Ashkin reported that the System Advisory Board (SAB) isn't able to send anyone to the CLA Conference. Ms. Ashkin was the only member of the SAB who was able to give a report to her county's Board of Supervisors. The SAB members discussed ways to approach their Board of Supervisors next year. Ms. Ashkin asked the Council members who don't currently have a SAB member, to start recruitment efforts because only 7 of the 12 SAB slots are filled. She stressed that SAB members are great advocates for the libraries. At their meeting this morning, the System Advisory Board voted to fund the purchase of bookmarks and posters for Children's Book Week for each library. The Board also decided to try to increase attendance at future meetings by using teleconferencing or videoconferencing for a few meetings. The Board would like to meet in person at least once or twice a year. Discussion ensued.

7. COMMITTEE REPORTS/NEW BUSINESS

A. REFERENCE COMMITTEE

1. CLSA REFERENCE DISCUSSION

Ms. Milliron reported that there has been no news from the State Library regarding the statewide reference changes. At the Library of CA board meeting in August, Susan Hildreth stated there won't be anything to report until a person is hired to direct that program. She did say that the CLSA money currently being used to purchase databases for systems won't be redirected by the State. NSCLS used about \$50,000 for databases last year. Ms. Milliron reminded the directors that Susan Hildreth would welcome their recommendations of suitable people to head the program as the State Library is still recruiting.

Betsy Emry asked Ms. Milliron to resend the information about how to submit reference questions to North Bay. Ms. Milliron told the Council that the library branches should submit their reference questions directly to the NBCLS Reference Department rather than going through NSCLS headquarters. Discussion ensued.

2. Database Promotion Materials

Ms. Milliron had asked the Council to bring samples of promotional materials that their library uses regarding the database. Betsy Emry reported that Siskiyou County used a press release which she also sent out to County staff. Margaret Miles brought the flyers that her staff had put together for Plumas County and reported that they are planning on putting them out in the collection area near the testing and Chilton's books. The flyer is attached to the minutes. Kitty Yancheff reported that Humboldt County is planning on having some of the library's computers default to the Testing Databases. Derek Wolfgram stated that Butte County has bookmarks which he will share.

B. AUTOMATION COMMITTEE

C. MEDIA DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The Council discussed the possibility of creating rotating DVD and Book on CD collections that would be owned by one library so TBR could be collected. It would be not be as labor intensive if the bib records went with the collection for upload by the library. Or, the collection could be split between each library as a permanent owner and then it could be shared through ILL, but libraries would have to be willing to lend their media collections. A compromise would be to give the rotating collections to libraries that don't want to loan items and give materials to libraries who are willing to share. Lori Ayre mentioned that having a true floating collection would be where an item stays with whatever library ends up with it. Ms. Ayre also mentioned that the cheapest, most cost effective method of delivery is to have the materials warehoused with easy-to-use online browsing and delivery through the U.S. postal service for \$2.13. Marilyn Cochran suggested giving the Listen-In collection to Butte College if they would be willing to loan it to public libraries. The TBR could be redirected to the College instead of North State and the VHS collection could be put up for grabs amongst the libraries. Ms. Ayre suggested VDX, a product that is used to search various library vendor platforms and could be used to promote easy access. Illiad is another OCLC product that could be explored. Ms. Ayre determined that each VHS and DVD title is being circulated 2 times while the books on CD are being circulated over 4 times apiece. She thought that a quick search of Netflix (in a batch file) would reveal which titles are readily available and which would be worth keeping. Ms. Cochran and Ms. Miles discussed the possibility of each taking a collection, DVDs to Orland Free Library and Books on CD to Plumas County Library, but there would still need to be a way for patrons to browse easily.

D. BUDGET COMMITTEE

1. FY 2007/08 BUDGET

The Budget Committee reviewed the current financial situation and discussed closing down the Video Center and Listen In earlier than the June 30th deadline set by the State Library. The Budget Committee recommended NSCLS discontinue the purchasing of new media for the Video Center and Listen In. No second was needed and the Motion passed unanimously.

A Motion authorizing Annette Milliron to notify the NSLCS staff and landlord that the North State office and Listen-In will be closed down by January 31st was made by Marilyn Cochran and seconded by Russell Long. The Motion passed unanimously.

The Council discussed when the System should stop circulating materials. There was consensus to keep the materials circulating until the last possible moment. A Motion to sell the surplus van was made by Russell Long and seconded by Derek Wolfgram. The Motion passed unanimously.

The Budget Committee recommended approval of the revised budget for FY 2007/08. No second was needed and the Motion passed unanimously.

E. CHILDREN'S SERVICES

The Children's Service report was presented in written form and is attached to the minutes.

F. Program & Services/Networking

1. RURAL INITIATIVE FY 2007/08

2. ARSL CONFERENCE

The ARSL conference was held in Columbus, Ohio this year. The next conference will be held in Sacramento in 2008 and the directors were encouraged to send staff.

3. Web 2.0 Workshops

Margaret Miles reported that only one workshop has been scheduled so far and it will be in November. She asked the Council how they felt about having the Web 2.0 and the Petting Zoo workshops back to back. Discussion ensued.

G. Personnel Committee

8. NEW BUSINESS

A. ANNUAL REPORT FY 2006/07

A Motion to approve the Annual Report for FY 2006/07 was made by Marilyn Cochran and seconded by Margaret Miles. The Motion passed unanimously.

B. JOINT MEETING OF SYSTEM REPRESENTATIVES

Ms. Milliron explained that the Steering Committees from NBCLS and MVLS would like to hold a joint meeting to discuss how things are going with System administration and would like to include NSCLS. Since NSCLS doesn't have a Steering Committee, Ms. Milliron is seeking volunteers to attend on either November 16th or 30th. Discussion ensued.

C. RESOURCE SHARING SUMMIT

The MVLS Steering Committee would like to hold a resource sharing summit with NBCLS and NSCLS because they don't have one resource sharing tool. They would like to invite the major vendors to come and demo their products. Sacramento Public Library volunteered to be the host. The Committee envisions each library director bringing one key staff person with them. They also talked about piggybacking this meeting on Legislative Day in April. Ms. Milliron asked for a volunteer to serve on the planning committee for the summit and Margaret Miles volunteered.

D. STRATEGIC PLANNING SESSION FOLLOW-UP

This item will be placed on the agenda for the meeting in December.




