- College does not have to be expensive. You have to find the right program and the right person, and the right application and you should be able to achieve your goals. Everyone should apply for the FASA through this website if they plan to access training via an educational institution. <https://fafsa.ed.gov/> There are many scam sites out there, be sure you only access the one ending in gov.
- Be sure to apply for all of the scholarships on campus and sign up for programs like EOPS, EOP, SAIL, etc. which offer additional support and aid for low-income first-generation students. Here are some local examples of these programs. Check your colleges for like programs.

- Check with various programs on campus that also cater to adult re-entry students, women, students with disabilities, foster care youth, students with children, etc. as there are additional financial programs and support systems for these populations.
- At some colleges if you are over 60, you can obtain a fee waiver to attend school. You can also get fee waivers if your parents died in the line of service, if you are a victim of a terrorist attack or human trafficking, etc. Check with financial aid for a fee waiver list to see if you qualify.

- Many employers offer tuition reimbursement including places like colleges and universities themselves. At colleges and universities, you can often even transfer your tuition reimbursement to family members. Some employers will only offer tuition reimbursement if you agree to sign a contract that you will stay with them for a certain length of time; otherwise you repay the loan.
